



Vision and Mission Policy

Vision and Mission statements provide schools with an overview of where they want to go and what they want to be. Vision and mission statements establish clear expectations and standards for the whole school community and help the school reach common goals.

Purpose of Vision and Mission

Vision and Mission statements are unspoken contracts between the organization and various stakeholders. A well-written statement can guide decision-making, resource allocations, policy decisions and how the school operates. By making their purpose clear, schools can set their goals and objectives into action.

Policy Statement

School vision statements outline a school's values and objectives. They provide parents and community a brief but clear overview of the overall ethos of the school. On the other hand, school mission statements explain what the school is currently doing to achieve its vision. Schools need both vision and mission statements to show their community what their values and beliefs are.

Vision and Mission Revision Process

The Vision and Mission statement is reviewed by all the stakeholders every four years. All stakeholders meet and discuss if the mission and vision have been achieved. The board creates a new mission and vision suitable for the school and discusses the changes with the stakeholders through various meetings. A strategic plan is created as a key function of the management to set priorities, allocate resources and ensure that everyone is working towards common goals and objectives.
